Walks Report. The walk to Faulconbridge Point & down into the Grose River was well attended & enjoyed by all, the great majority taking the strenuous climb down the old logging track into the Grose, unfortunately your walks convener was unable to be present so has no report on bird and flower sightings, but report us it as most enjoyable. this was the July outing.

The August walk to Martins Lookout Springwood, descent into Glenbrook creek which was followed up, past the "Perch Ponds & return via Wiggins Track was a very enjoyable outing, taken in perfect weather, apart from a short, sharp shower ahead of a cold front. Many birds were observed, especially as two species of banksias were in flower viz. *pinulosa* & *collina*? (apparently the Blue Mts specie previously known as "collina" has been given a new name), several orchids were observed in flower, greenhoods (*Pterostylis*) & also "Pixie-caps" (*Acianthus fornicatus*) a fallen tree was also seen covered with *Bulbophyllum* orchids (possibly "*crassulifolium*" which has been observed in the Springwood area. Many acacias were blooming as were *Hardenbergias*, many fine specimens of turpentine (*Syncarpia*), *Eucalyptus* spp. and of course *Sassafras*, a smaller tree with fragrance in all its parts (*Atherosperma moschatum*) after which the gully was named. It was nice to see that new signboards had been placed along this fine walk, making the track much easier to find. -K.G.
