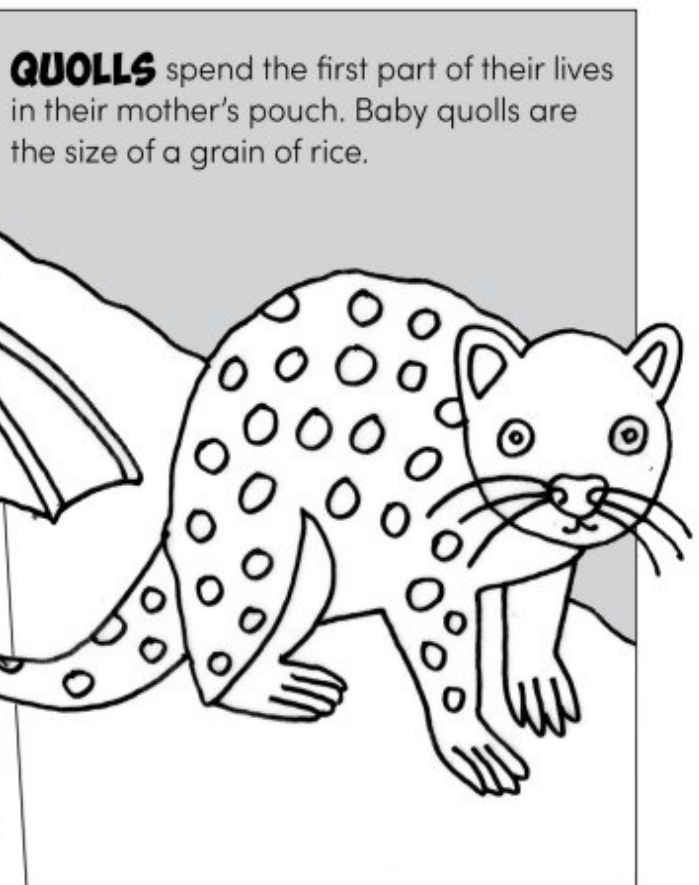
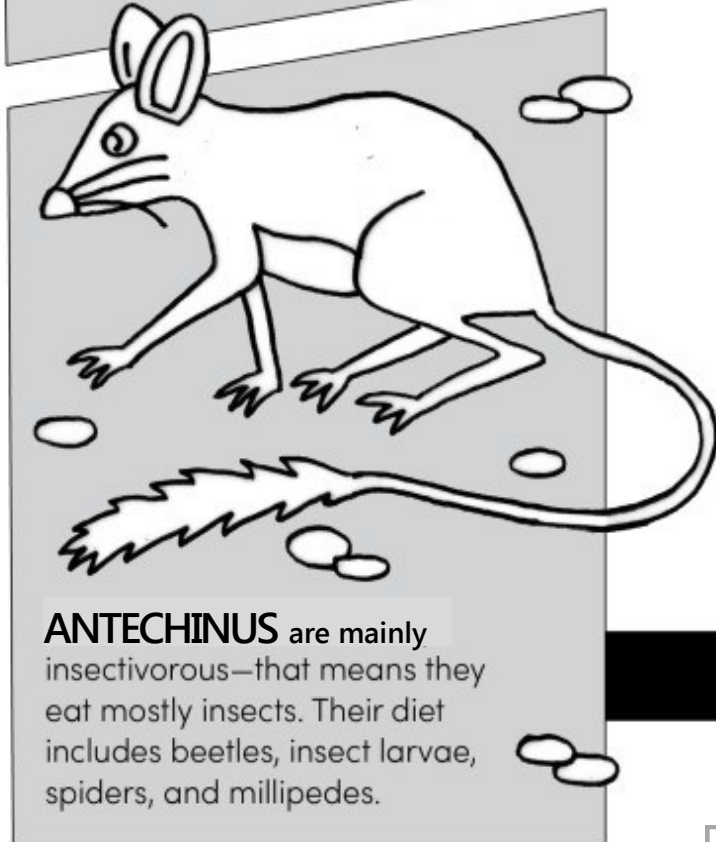




BATS help maintain a healthy environment by eating up to 1,000 insects each day!
