

Coal Seam Gas (CSG) - What you can do!

Take this flyer home, read it, research, think, and then Act!

Background In September 2012 the O'Farrell Coalition government "*green lighted*" state-wide CSG exploration, production, and "fracking". Not one square inch of NSW has been guaranteed protection. Our best agricultural lands and environmentally sensitive areas are all up for grabs.

If you live in the lower Blue Mountains or far western suburbs of Sydney you are almost certainly covered by a Petroleum Exploration Licence (PEL2) held by AGL. AGL is actively exploring in the Camden/Campbelltown area, and has already moved from exploration to full industrial production in some areas. And, if you live elsewhere, do not think CSG does not effect you - if you drink water, then it does! The O'Farrell government (breaking a pre-election "guarantee" made by the Premier himself) is actually set to allow drilling in our main water catchment area.

What you can do! (See Resources Section over page for info links, politician contact details etc)

- Learn More: The most effective initial action anyone can take is to learn more about what CSG is, how CSG is extracted, and the damage this industry can have on our land, our water, and our health.
- Let State Politicians know you are NOT happy: Contact the Premier Barry O'Farrell, the Planning Minister Brad Hazzard, the Resources and Energy Minister Chris Hartcher, Blue Mountains local member Roza Sage, and Penrith local member Stuart Ayres. Let them know their current policy is unacceptable. (Contact details in Resources Section over page)
- **Spread the Word:** Talk to your family, friends, neighbours, and work colleagues. Let them know what is happening and give them a copy of this flyer.
- **Sign CSG Petitions:** Though sometimes ignored petitions make sure that politicians *cannot* say that no one is concerned and if there are enough signatories (10,000+) then the petition must be discussed in parliament. Please don't tire of signing them. Read the petition, if you believe it to be sensible and well founded then sign it. The more the better.
- Use your Consumer Power: If you are a domestic gas user then consider changing to 100% GreenPower (Accredited Renewable) electricity. Alternatively, at least examine the ethics of your current gas supplier (are they also into CSG drilling and fracking?) and change supplier if necessary.
- **Become Active, participate in Organisations Opposing CSG:** In the Blue Mountains become a member of the Blue Mountains Conservation Society (decades of solid environmental achievement), perhaps attend a *Stop CSG Blue Mountains* meeting and get involved in coming actions.
- Attend CSG Events: Whether it's a rally, a march, or a blockade protecting a farmer's property please try to attend if you can. It's all about numbers, and even if all you do is stand there then you have made a big contribution.
